

CORONAVIRUS-RELATED LEGISLATIVE SESSION CHANGES

State	Summary
Alabama	The legislature is out on break. They will convene 03/31 (five days after its scheduled return from spring break).
Alaska	Still in session, but the legislature has a contingency plan that calls for adjournment if at least five lawmakers get COVID-19. Some hearings will be held by teleconference.
Arizona	Adjourned until 04/13
Arkansas	Special session 04/26 – 28 on budget.
California	Joint recess from 03/20 – 04/13.
Colorado	Adjourned until 03/30.
Connecticut	Adjourned until 03/30.
Delaware	Legislative session suspended indefinitely.
District of Columbia	No changes to session, but the council will be able to meet virtually.
Florida	Session scheduled to adjourn on 03/13 (not affected by coronavirus.) However, because the legislature did not yet pass a budget, the session is extended until 03/20.
Georgia	Suspended indefinitely.

State	Summary
	Adjourns sine die 04/02.
Hawaii	Suspended indefinitely.
Idaho	Adjourned 03/20 (not affected by coronavirus.)
Illinois	Session cancelled, but could be called to return at the discretion of House and Senate leadership.
Indiana	Adjourned sine die 03/14 (not affected by coronavirus.)
Iowa	Suspended until 04/12.
Kansas	Adjourned until 04/27. Scheduled for a veto session 04/27 – 05/15.
Kentucky	Adjourns sine die on 04/15.
Louisiana	Suspended until 03/31. On 03/31 the legislature is scheduled to convene for a single day then go on recess until 04/13.
Maine	Adjourned sine die on 03/17.
Maryland	Adjourned sine die, may come back.
Massachusetts	N/A
Michigan	The Legislature is moving to a one-session-day-a-week schedule for the next month. They are now scheduled to meet on 4/1, 4/7, and 4/15.
